Dear Marc,

I wanted to take a moment to thank you. My father Glenn S was diagnosed with Parkinson's by Dr Shankle in February of 2017, and at that time he was beginning to really struggle with daily life. He had started a rapid decline in health both physically and mentally. We were seeing changes almost weekly. He was having a hard time picking up his feet to walk as he hunched forward, bringing a spoon to his mouth was becoming a tearful struggle, his tremors would come and go, the depression was great and getting worse. He would stare away, and we would all try to bring him back to reality. He was sleeping throughout the day. Around December of 2018 my dad was asked by Dr. Shankle, a neurologist that runs the neuro movement center at Hoag Hospital in Newport Beach, California, to please consider a new treatment for brain disorders. They had begun to see great success in his patients that had been using the Kurve system. We all discussed this and figured we had nothing to lose and he had to try it. My Father received a prescription for IGG and information on your company to contact in order to purchase a nasal delivery system that would possibly help him with Parkinson's.

Fast forward: 8/27/2019 (9months later)

My Father has been using the IGG with the Kurve nasal delivery system every 2 weeks. In the beginning, his tremors were so severe that he needed assistance holding the machine to his nose. However, he is now back at work full time, driving himself. He no longer shuffles. Eating is second nature with no more struggles to bring his hand to mouth and drooling is completely gone. The tremor in his hands are almost totally gone, just a slight bit left. He has gone back to working out with his trainer 3 days a week. The distant stare is gone. He is engaged and present. The depression is completely under control. His employees say, "Glenn is taking a break from Parkinson's". No one can believe the change. I wanted you to know how thankful we are to you and your company. We tell everyone about our experience, and we hope and pray that more doctors will be willing to think outside the box and try new treatments for devastating brain diseases. This is something we never thought possible.

## April 16, 2020

Good afternoon, I wanted to reach out to you with a situation that arose with my father. I felt this was a very important and should be brought to your attention. My father has now been on the Kurve inhaler for approximately 18 months with improvements monthly and the symptoms have arrested in his Parkinson's. He is still at work four days a week, drives, exercises and remains extremely social. You would not know he had been diagnosed with Parkinson's 2 years ago.

Five months ago we are contacted by the pharmacy informing us that Gammagard, the manufacturer of the IgG he uses with his inhaler, was having a nationwide shortage and that he

would be unable to continue treatment until the medication was back in stock. He was forced to stop using the inhaler. Within two weeks his shuffle was back, he was deeply depressed, and the tremors were coming back at an alarming rate. Dr Shankle was able to prescribe a different IgG manufacturer for my father to try. At this point it had been 4 weeks since treatment.

He received the medication and very quickly, in a weeks' time of using the inhaler, his symptoms regressed and he was back to his old self again.

The Parkinson's symptoms just sort of faded away. After not having it for a couple of weeks, I wanted you to understand how important this therapy is to our family.
